Jesus Our Savior Lutheran Outreach, Winnebago (project #273-1)

The ministry of Jesus Our Savior Lutheran Outreach shares the love of God with the 2,500 Native Americans living on the Winnebago Reservation in northeast Nebraska through worship, Bible study, confirmation instruction, and youth programs, such as after school mid-week and summer Vacation Bible School. Ministry is also done in the area jail, treatment centers, and hospitals. A preschool was started by the ministry in 1998 and it is now an independent Recognized Service Organization of the LCMS. It may be supported by direct donations to the Jesus Our Savior Lutheran School Association.

Sandhills Ministry (project #261-1)

This ministry is made up of three congregations: Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church in Hyannis, Bingham Lutheran Church 20 miles west of Hyannis, and Faith Lutheran Church 35 miles north of Hyannis. From these outposts, a variety of people and needs are served through worship services, a Lutheran preschool, Vacation Bible School, Bible studies, and personal visits.

Several other LCMS congregations in the Sandhills also serve the farmers and ranchers in the area. These congregations include Zion Lutheran Church in Arnold, Trinity Lutheran Church in Thedford, Zion Lutheran Church in Crookston, and Grace Lutheran Church in Merriman, as well as a preaching station in Cody.
